

SCHOLARSHIPS - ADDITIONAL NOTES

The applicant is required to write a letter addressed to Miss Fox, Head, explaining in her own words, why she is applying for the scholarship. A separate letter is required for each Scholarship applied for. Each letter should be no more than **500** words and handwritten.

For example:

- Musicians should include current grades on instruments, and involvement in choirs, ensembles, and performances to date
- Sportswomen should include involvement and achievement in teams, clubs and tournaments, whether in or outside of School
- Actors should include productions they have taken part in, Speech and Drama or equivalent grades and favourite plays or genres of performance
- Artists should include recent exhibitions attended and favourite artistic projects, or artists they are inspired by
- Dancers should include disciplines they are trained in, certificates gained and shows they have been a part of
- Swimmers should include stroke strengths, involvement in squads, galas attended and competitions qualified for

Please ensure that you have collated the required supporting documentation, including audition pieces, video content (if required), Performance Swimming application with timings, and in the case of Art, photographs of pieces in the portfolio which it would not be feasible for the applicant to bring in for assessment (the portfolio itself will be required on the assessment day).

Most documents and files can be sent through as an attached file; if you have any difficulties uploading information please contact Admissions at your earliest opportunity in advance of the stated deadline.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

We understand that:

1. External candidates for the Art, Performing Arts, Drama, Music, Sports or Swimming Scholarships will be invited to a Scholarship assessment day at St George's provided they submit the required documentation by the deadline.
2. Performing Swimming Scholarships applicants will only be invited to attend the swimming assessment day if shortlisted.
3. Exhibitions are worth 5% of school tuition fees and may be offered to pupils who are unsuccessful in their Scholarship applications.
4. Where a candidate receives more than one Scholarship or Exhibition, only the higher discount applies. Discounts are not cumulative. If pupils are already in receipt of a fee discount, the award is an honorary award.
5. For new pupils, Scholarships and Exhibitions may be further enhanced by means-tested bursaries. The deadline to apply for a bursary is **11 October** each year. Applications for bursaries should not be sent before you have completed the registration form for your daughter and the accompanying payment. Applications are welcome from the start of the academic year preceding the year of entry (e.g. Year 6 for Year 7 admission, or Year 8 for a deferred entry Year 9 admission).
6. Drama awards (free Speech and Drama tuition) are also occasionally offered to applicants.
7. Girls who are awarded Scholarships at 11+ and 13+ will remain scholars into the Sixth Form in accordance with our scholarship terms and conditions.
8. Scholarships are reviewed annually. Scholars are expected to work to the best of their ability and to be good ambassadors for the School and committed to their awarded discipline. In exceptional circumstances, and after a period of warning, a scholarship may be revoked if a girl does not maintain the standards expected by the School of a scholar in her field.
